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Its title is a reference to the 1995 crime film *Out of Sight*, and was chosen by Kesha after spending several weeks with her fiancé, R&B singer-songwriter Russell Dewitt. A deluxe edition of the album was released on March 10, 2013, and features bonus tracks. In March 2013, Kesha gave a voice-recorded interview to MTV News, in which she explained the reasons for the album's delayed release and the struggles she had faced during the recording process. She also explained why she had turned to religion as a coping mechanism. Kesha's album *Warrior* debuted at number one on the US Billboard 200 chart, selling 129,000 copies in its first week, and was certified Gold by the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) in its first month of release. It became Kesha's third top-ten album in the United States, following *Animal* (2010) and *Rainbow* (2012). History In March 2013, Kesha performed at the Ultra Music Festival in Miami, Florida and decided to record an album. Kesha also felt inspired to record the album after spending a month with her fiancé, R&B singer-songwriter Russell Dewitt. The album was produced by various producers including Max Martin, Bloodshy & Avant, Jazzy Pha, and Dr. Luke. Kesha's vocals were recorded at Larrabee North Studios in North Hollywood, California and later mixed at Studio at the Palms in Las Vegas, Nevada. *Warrior* was released on November 30, 2012. The cover of *Warrior* features an oil painting, created by American artist Jim Jones. On March 10, 2013, Kesha's second studio album, *Warrior* was released in North America in physical format and on digital platforms, and was released worldwide on March 13, 2013. The album featured a cover of a song written by Toni Braxton, titled "Un-Break My Heart", which was included on the deluxe edition. As with its predecessor, Kesha worked with a variety of producers, including Jimmy Iovine, who she met during the recording sessions for *Rainbow*, Max Martin, Bloodshy & Avant, Timbaland and Jazzy Pha, among others. Kesha worked with songwriters on the album, including the writers of three songs, including "C'mon Get Up" which was written by T.I., Belly and Kesha, who originally performed it on the song "Boots and Pregnant" from *She* 82157476af

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
